

Vanessa E. Wyche

Director, NASA's Johnson Space Center



Vanessa E. Wyche is the director of NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston, home to America's astronaut corps, Mission Control Center, International Space Station, Orion, and Gateway programs, and its more than 11,000 civil service and contractor employees. Her responsibilities included a broad range of human spaceflight activities, including development and operation of human spacecraft and NASA astronaut selection and training.

Previously, Wyche was the acting associate administrator of NASA, serving as the senior advisor to NASA acting administrator Sean Duffy. Wyche led the agency's 10 center directors as well as the mission directorate associate administrators at NASA Headquarters in Washington. She acted as the agency's chief operating officer for more than 18,000 employees and an annual budget of more than \$24 billion.

Wyche also oversaw NASA Johnson's activities supporting the commercialization of low Earth orbit, supporting the agency's needs following the transition from the International Space Station in 2030, and led the center's programs supporting the exploration of the Moon and Mars, including surface system capabilities for human and commercial robotic missions, as well as simulated missions for crews on Mars.

During her 35-year career, Wyche has held several other leadership roles including Johnson's deputy center director, director of Exploration Integration and Science Directorate, flight manager of several Space Shuttle Program missions, and executive officer in the Office of the Administrator, as well as additional center-level technical and program organizations.

A native of South Carolina, Wyche earned a Bachelor of Science in Engineering and Master of Science in Bioengineering from Clemson University and was inducted into the Thomas Green Clemson Academy of Engineers and Scientists in 2019. She received an honorary Doctor of Science degree from Coastal Carolina University in 2022 as well as an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from Texas Southern University in 2024.

Wyche is a member of the National Academy of Engineering. She has numerous awards and recognitions, notably the Presidential Rank Award, two NASA Outstanding Leadership Medals, and two NASA Achievement Medals, and she is an AIAA Associate Fellow.

Wyche is a passionate promoter of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), and serves as a member of American Institute of Physics Foundation board of trustees, Clemson University's College of Engineering, Computing, and Applied Sciences advisory board, and is a past chair of the Space Center Houston board of directors.

Wyche is married to George Wyche Jr. Esq, and has one son, George Wyche III.

Standing at his memorial tree, that wish became a mission. Thanks to Florence School District 3, ten students and three staff members traveled to NASA, fulfilling Cheryl's vision and honoring Aunt Pearl's dream.

Our commitment to STEM education remains strong, supported by the dedication of our four pilots—Qualario Brown, Cedric Davis, Craig Harrison, and Taj Troy as well as our 5k health initiatives and academic scholarships help us uplift and empower the next generation. Dr. Ronald E. McNair Biography

Ronald Erwin McNair was born on October 21, 1950, in Lake City, South Carolina, to Carl and Peral McNair. He attended North Carolina A&T State University, where he graduated magna cum laude with a B.S. Degree in physics in 1971. McNair then enrolled in the prestigious Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), where he earned his Ph.D. Degree in Physics in 1976, at the age of 25.

Dr. McNair soon became a recognized expert in laser physics while working as a staff physicist with Hughes Research Laboratory. NASA selected him for the space shuttle program in 1978 and assigned him as a mission specialist aboard the 1984 flight of the shuttle Challenger.

Besides his academic achievements, Dr. McNair received three honorary doctorate degrees and many fellowships and commendations. These included Presidential Scholar, 1961-71; Ford Foundation Fellow, 1971-74; National Fellowship Fund Fellow, 1974-75; named Omega Psi Phi Scholar of the year, 1975; Distinguished National Scientist, National Society of Black Professional Engineers, 1979; and the Friend of Freedom Award, 1981, as well as many others. He also held a fifth-degree black belt in karate and was an accomplished jazz saxophonist. He was married to Cheryl McNair and had two children, Reginald Ervin McNair and Joy Cheray McNair.

After he died in the Challenger space shuttle accident in January 1986, members of Congress provided funding for the Ronald E. McNair Post-Baccalaureate Achievement Program, dedicated to the high standard of achievements that Dr. McNair's life represented. The purpose of this TRIO program is to increase the attainment of doctoral degrees by students from underrepresented segments of society.¹ This year, there are 197 McNair TRIO programs funded to serve 5,403 students from first generation, low-income, and underrepresented backgrounds. The total federal funding for McNair programs is over \$55 million and supports programs in 47 states and Puerto Rico.²

Dr. McNair's legacy is visible in the accomplishments of TRIO McNair alumni, like NASA astronaut **José M. Hernández**³ whose life story is showcased in the film *A Million Miles Away*. A few other notable TRIO McNair alumni are⁴ **Nikema Williams** (first African-American woman to chair the Georgia Democratic party), **Sarah Smarsh** (*New York Times* best-selling author), **Cornelius Griggs** (one of the largest construction contractors in the Midwest), **Tara Ruttley** (NASA alumnus and Chief Scientist for Orbital Reef), and **Aaron Rahsaan Thomas** (producer and screenwriter, known for "S.W.A.T.", "CSI: NY," and "Friday Night Lights").

One of the lasting legacies of the life of Dr. McNair is the Ronald E. McNair Post-baccalaureate Achievement Program, commonly known as TRIO McNair Scholars. Since the first programs began in 1989, thousands of first-generation, low-income, and underrepresented students have been able to fulfill their dreams of attending graduate school, producing cutting edge research, and earning doctoral degrees. Just like Dr. McNair, these scholars are changing the world through their scholarly work.
